It is truly an honor to write today in support of the nomination of the Honorable Britt C. Grant to serve on the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. Justice Grant has a proven commitment to upholding the U.S. Constitution and the rule of law, and she possesses the qualifications, intellect, temperament and judicial philosophy to be an excellent choice for the Eleventh Circuit.

Governor Nathan Deal appointed Justice Grant to the Supreme Court of Georgia on January 1, 2017. Before joining the court, Justice Grant served as Solicitor General for the State of Georgia in the Office of the Attorney General, both for my predecessor Sam Olens and for me.

Justice Grant worked on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. for Congressman Nathan Deal before serving at the White House under President George W. Bush. While with the administration Justice Grant handled domestic policy issues for the Domestic Policy Council and the Office of Cabinet Affairs.

During her time at Stanford Law School, Justice Grant served as President of the Stanford Federalist Society and was co-founder and co-president of the Stanford National Security and the Law Society. She was also the managing editor of the Stanford Journal of International Law.


After graduating with distinction from Stanford Law School, Justice Grant clerked for the Honorable Brett M. Kavanaugh of the United States Court of Appeals for the

District of Columbia. She then joined the firm of Kirkland & Ellis LLP and worked with clients in commercial litigation before state courts, federal district courts, federal circuit courts and the United States Supreme Court.

Justice Grant returned to her home state of Georgia and began work with the Office of the Georgia Attorney General as Counsel for Legal Policy. She was appointed Solicitor General in January of 2015 where she represented the State in water litigation and other cases before the United States Supreme Court and a wide range of appellate matters before the Georgia Supreme Court, the Georgia Court of Appeals and the Federal Court of Appeals.

These experiences, her impeccable reputation and her proven record on the bench give me great confidence that Justice Grant will be an outstanding member of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. As such, I give my unqualified support.
